DERBYSHIRE ALERT

- This was re-instated in October 2019 and now has 30,000 users on the system.
- The system puts out alerts about any aspects of crime or geographic areas that registered users have selected.
- We are asking all Horsewatch members to register for Derbyshire Alert. Horsewatch and Farmwatch are selectable alerts on the system, ie members can request alerts about those things specifically.
- How to register is attached to these minutes and has been posted onto the website, with notifications and links also posted on Derbyshire Horsewatch site. All groups with facebook pages are asked to copy the information and post to their groups **Action : All**
- If you are already registered Derbyshire Alert, please check that you have selected Horsewatch and Farmwatch in your preferences – **USE IT OR LOSE IT.**

1. MATTERS ARISING

2. COUNTY CO-ORDINATOR / RURAL CRIME TEAM REPORT

- The RCT have undertaken animal handling training with Cheshire Police.

3. WATCH REPORTS

- **Amber Valley** – Ongoing issues with the ponies on Sir Frank Whittle Way. Following floods in November, all agencies are now involved. 2 issues reported of aggressive drivers and abusive behaviour. Suspicious person reported in a field in Bargate, spoken to by a horse owner and no further incidents.

- **High Peak** – 1 escaped horse returned to owner

5. BE AWARE THIS QUARTER

- Trailer and Horsebox Security
 - i. Refresh Photos and description to take account of any new damage / marks.
 - ii. Make sure you have a record of the chassis number.
 - iii. Where possible, register your trailer with the manufacturer (Ifor Williams definitely offer this service – check with your manufacturer).
- Update your horse photos to make sure you have a full set of summer and winter.
- Make sure that you report any stolen batteries to the Police. They can be used in the making of Crystal Meth. So, pockets of battery thefts may indicate a nearby lab.

2. Complete "Basic Information" page with the contact details that you want the alerts to go to.
3. Complete "Home Address" page so that the alerts you get can be geographically useful. Type in your postcode and select your address on the drop-down menus, then click anywhere on the screen and the map will refresh.
4. The next page is equal opportunities monitoring, but you can select Prefer Not to Say on each one.
5. "Your Community Memberships" is the page where you select what you want to hear about. Click on Horsewatch and you may also want to pick up Farmwatch, as thefts of agricultural vehicles, break-ins on farms, etc are related to equine crime. You can select any other aspects that you want to know about.

6. Select how you want to be contacted. The Advanced settings allows you to add times and different preferences for different times of the day.
7. On the "Who Can Contact You" page, make sure that you have ticked The Police, as this is where crime alerts come from, along with any others that may be of interest. Consent and Proceed at the bottom of the page.
8. Will ask you if you want to join or start a NW. If there is one in your area, it may be worth considering, in which case click join and you will be taken through to your nearest Watch. If not, just Skip.
9. The Verify box is the equivalent of the I am Not a Robot that you see on many sites. Finish.

When you get the confirmation email YOU MUST VERIFY YOUR ACCOUNT to activate it. Click on the link and it will take you to "Member Administration Area". Check that the name and address are yours, and you are all set up. Log out at the bottom of the menu on
